

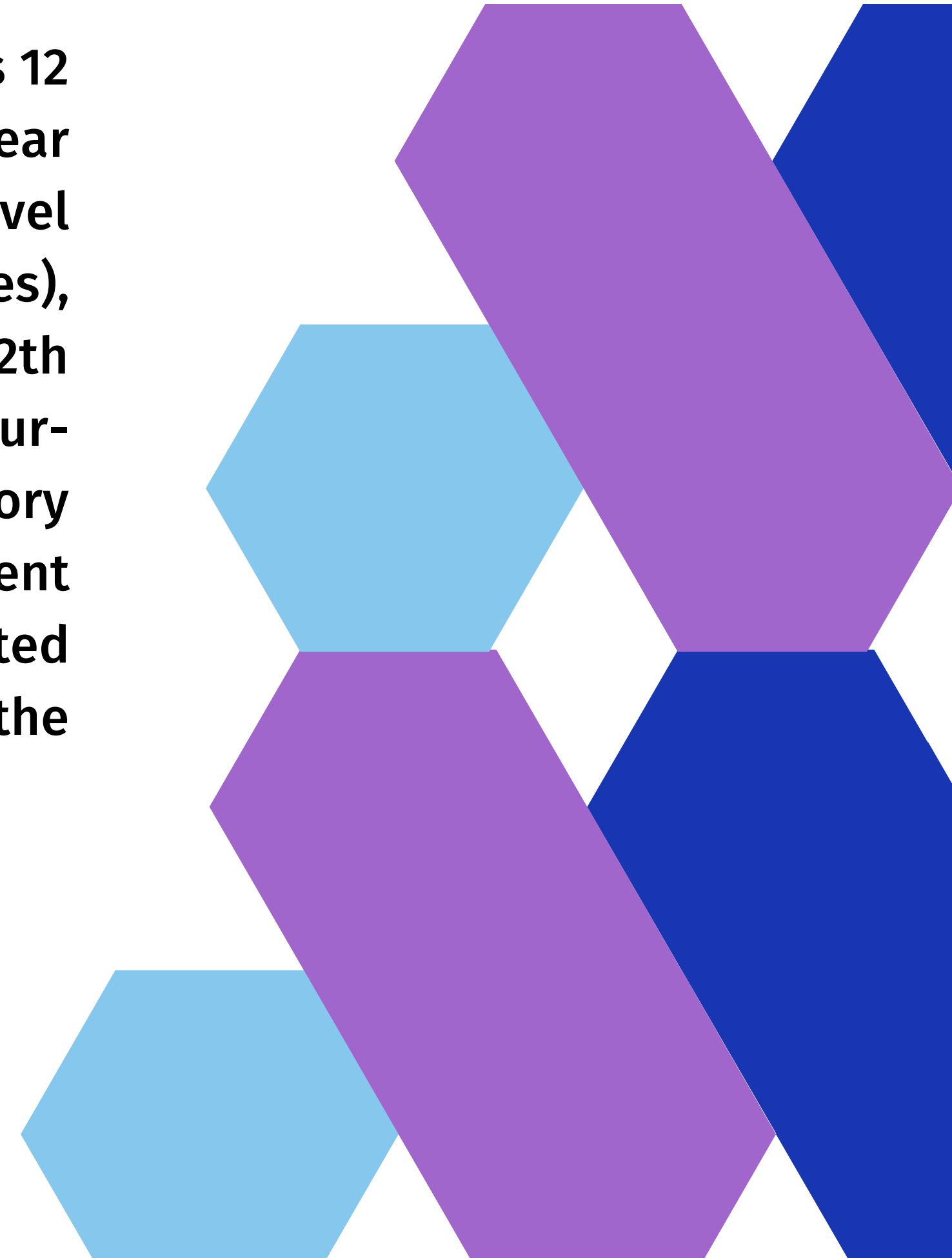
# TURKISH EDUCATION SYSTEM

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**The Turkish education system is divided into three stages as 12 years of compulsory education. The first level is four-year primary school (1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th grades), the second level is four-year secondary school (5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grades), and the third level is four-year high school (9. 10. 11 . and 12th grade) was organized as. Primary education consists of four-year compulsory primary schools, four-year compulsory secondary schools that allow choice between different programs. In secondary schools elective courses are created according to the abilities, development and preferences of the students in a way to support high school education.**





# Primary School

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## 1st grade to 4th grade

To educate students as global citizens who give priority to science, logic and aesthetics (art), respect other cultures while preserving their national and personal identity, are sensitive to the nature they live in and live in peace, innovative, inquiring and open-minded, with high research and communication skills, purposes.



# Middle School

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## 5th grade to 8th grade

They are individuals who have the technological knowledge required by the age, have gained the habit of disciplined and regular work, have high academic achievements, and have realized themselves in social, sports and artistic fields. Individuals who are sensitive to their environment, aware of their responsibilities, and loyal to national and moral values are raised.





# High School

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**9th grade to 12th grade**

There are several different types of high schools in Turkey. These are about normal (Anatolian) high school, science high school, art high school, sports high school and vocational high school (there are many types).

# University

**The number of years varies from department to department.**

The education given varies according to the department you choose. However, in order to enter the department or faculty, you need to get the score of that faculty from the exam. The name of this exam is the University Exam. It takes place in 2 stages. All candidates are required to take the 1st stage exam because this exam covers the basic proficiency test. Students who take the exam in the 2nd stage solve that test according to the type of department they want, and this is the field proficiency test.
